Barr & Stroud Ltd; optical instrument engineers, Glasgow, Scotland (GUAS Ref: UGD 295)

Specialising in naval and military rangefinders, Barr & Stroud had also been a major supplier of periscopes, binoculars and signalling equipment and continues to be one of the world's leading military optics firms. Their range included bombing, gunnery and photographic sights for aircraft; antiaircraft fire control equipment; aircraft gun mounts and indicating equipment. Plans and records of orders for such equipment survive with the collection.

Beardmore, William & Co Ltd; steel manufacturers and engineers, Glasgow, Scotland (GUAS Ref: UGD 100/1 and UGD 179)

Beardmores were heavy engineers who supplied tanks, artillery and aircraft in the two World Wars, as well as the naval ordnance and armoured plate in which they specialised. Evidence of their aeroplane and airship production can be found in photographs and magazine articles as well as in the firm's ledgers.

Morris Furniture Co Ltd; furniture manufacturers, Glasgow, Scotland (GUAS Ref: UGD 335)

Morris's wood processing skills were impressed during the Second World War for the production of aircraft fuselages and components and rifles. They pioneered the development of composite propellers for training and second line aircraft. Records of their wartime production include drawings, reports, cost and order books and correspondence files.
